> conservative repertoire of well known programs, but to no avail.
>
> Can anyone please tell me why this is happening and what I can do to fix
> it? The PC is running perfectly, otherwise. I just wondered if there were
> any issues with Norton Antivirus, as this program seems to be quite memory
> intensive??? Spec: AMD Athlon XP 2200+, 1.80ghz, 512 RAM, Win XP (Home)
> fully updated with all patches.
