Alan,

I know that you are trying to help folks.

My News Server, msnews.microsoft.com, has nothing to do with it.

Consider that you are posting using Outlook Express formatted in HTML.

Consider that the OP was using CDO. Most CDO posters cannot see or even click on real links, let alone something like: Look here

I am Using OE, like you are, however I have mine set to Read all messages in plain text.

[[When you create messages using HTML formatting, only e-mail programs that support HTML can read the formatting. If the recipient's e-mail or news reading program cannot read HTML, the message is displayed as plain text with an HTML file attached.]]

CDO does not support file attachments, so the OP wouldn't even see an attachment.

So the OP and I see Look here in plain text, not as a live link in blue that leads to...

If the OP can't click on or paste your hyperlink into the IE Address bar, what good is it? Who have you helped?

So post in Plain text or use an URL.

[[To set up Outlook Express so that your message replies are sent in a format that the originator's e-mail or news reading program can read, in the main window, on the Tools menu, click Options, and then click the Send tab. Select the Reply to messages using the format in which they were sent check

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box.]]
