It's working! I have no idea what happened, but it is working like it's supposed to.

After I replaced both .ini files I re-booted but it did nothing to solve the problem. So I once again, as a final attempt to avoid a complete re-install of windows, used my WinXP Pro disc and did a repair. After it was completed, I tried the programs I had previously downloaded but would not install, and it still did not work. (BTW, these programs were the following: Storm Predator update; Ad-Aware; CounterSpy and a2Squared Anti-Malware. All these programs gave me the same 16 bit error) I decided to re-download the Storm Predator update and try one more time. When I downloaded it, it had a regular Storm Predator icon, where as the first

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few times I downloaded it, it had an icon that looked square. So I tried installing it and it worked! What the..? So I redownloaded the rest and everything worked!

I really does bother me not knowing what caused the problem, and even more, what cured the problem.

No matter what, I would like to thank you very much for all your assistance with this.
