Hi .Can anyone tell me if it is possible to Rollback (undo) the Downloaded Automatic Updates that have been installed on my computer.  
I would like to find the offending download from Microsoft that I am now totally convinced has put my operating System out of wack.  
I would like to be able to go from the most recent download and remove them one at a time until I find the offender.  
I have found that my System Restore no longer works properly , ie most of the old Restore Points no longer exist and when I do find a valid point I get a message saying like "Failed to Restore".  
I also get Internet Explorer Script Errors in most programs EVEN WHEN I'M NOT ON THE INTERNET.  
And yes I have tried some of the other remedies proposed to others with the same problems in the Knowledge Browser strings.  
And yes I have had my system thoroughly scanned for Viruses etc with my own installed software and Online scans by others and found to be clean.  
Failing a successfull remedy by this forum I may be forced to Re-format my HD and re-install the software and then block all Automatic Updates from Microsoft.  
System Details are:- Windows OS XP Professional with all the latest Updates & Patches.  
Internet Explorer:-Version 7.0.5730.11  
Also have the Windows Security Centre with latest updates.
