I would think that one light was the 'on' light, and the blinking one was the hard drive. If so, I would make a quick attempt to save as much critical data as possible to some permanent media. (burn a cd, find a network storage location, or whatever) The clicking could well mean you have a failing hard drive.

On a lighter note, there is acutally a 'click' sound in the the sounds app of control panel, (called 'start.wav') It could be tied to the "Navigation" event.
