> >I'm puzzled by your message. You can either enable sharing on the  
> >wireless card OR add a network bridge, but you can't do both. Windows  
> >XP won't let you share a bridged connection. Which one did you do?

> >I recommend using the network bridge if it will work. If the network  
> >bridge won't work, then enable ICS on the wireless connection, which  
> >will give Internet access to another computer that connects to the  
> >wired connection.

> >To enable ICS on a network connection:  
> >  
> >1. Right-click the connection.  
> >2. Click Properties.  
> >3. Click Advanced.  
> >4. Put a check mark in the box for Internet Connection Sharing.

set the IP address of the network bridge to 192.168.0.1 since after creating

the

bridge, it had an IP starting with 169.
