A mapping from Win98 to linux worked fine.
A mapping from XP to only the Windows SBS server worked fine.

XP removed from domain xyz and placed in workgroup xyz, mappings working oke!!!

> > We have a 2003SBS server with AD/DNS/DHCP/wins and a Linux/Samba
> > fileserver.
> > Clients are Windows XP pro in a domain. Users get drive mappings to
> > the shares on the 2003 and Linux server through a kix script.
> >
> > When users browse in their windows explorer to their drive mappings

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> > *this takes about 10–15 seconds before they open. After this first*
> > *time, browsing and copying files is normal/fast. After serveral minuts*
> > *of (inactivity to the mapping) connecting or switching to other drive*
> > *mappings this is slow again.*
> >
> > *The network drives are not disconnected and no errors in the logfiles.*
> > *Ping on DNS and Wins names are oke.*
