>show up. But sometimes if we wait a period of time during the day the
>machines will show up.
>We do have DNS servers in our network.

Jeff,

this is a common problem with the computer browser service, which seems to be a bit unreliable. It depends, for example, on the sequence and timing of when the computers are switched on.

If you have a few servers that run continuously, you could set all other computers, particularly client computers, not to become computer browsers.
