> > between the computers. Both computers can see the other but when I click

> > The only information I can find on this error refers to "Telnet Users" and
> > not having the access set up correctly. This is not something that I ever
> > set
> > up previously.

> > I have both computers password protected but previous to this problem it
> > would just ask for the password and then grant access to the shared files.
> >
> > In addition to this problem "C2" has also just recently lost communication
> > with the printer installed on C1. This happened at least 1 month after I
> > lost
> > the access to shared files. I have tried re-installing the printer on C1
> > but
> > when you add a network printer to C2 it cannot see any printers on C1.

> > I double checked all the "sharing" that I could think of but I am stumped.
> >
> > Any help or suggestions would be greatly appreciated.
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
