I managed to set up a password on a Windows XP Home Edition network by adding a password to the guest account on each computer. Now when I try to connect to another computer, it prompts for a password, unless you're logged into a user account with a matching password.

Success.

However, I want to be able to print to the different computers, without having to give out this password. Otherwise, there would be no purpose in giving out the password.

Any ideas?

I was thinking maybe I could delete the guest account on a computer, and then give permissions to individual user accounts...This might be a risky thing to do though.
