SP2, even
if there were no issues. An XP computer without any service
packs has
dozens of security vulnerabilities that the service packs have
fixed.

Local Area Connection4,Enabled,Shared(Cable-Modem),
and network bridge15,enabled.

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Host works fine, properties of NIC: General: Connected, Support: all unavailable.

properties of lac4:General:

Connected(sent/received:yes), Support: assigned by dhcp,ip address:yes, subnet mask:255.255.255.0,gateway:yes.

properties of bridge: General:connected,

sent:some,received:none, Support: addr type: Automatic Private address,ip address:yes , subnet mask:255.255.0.0 , gateway:none.

error msg: "couldnt renew ip address for network bridge."

What do ya say, seems something is blocking the connection..

This should get things working:

1. Right-click and delete the network bridge. You don't need it, and it could be causing problems.
2. Un-share and re-share Local Area Connection 4.
3. Check the properties of Local Area Connection. It should show:

IP Address: 192.168.0.1

Subnet Mask: 255.255.255.0

Default Gateway: none

DNS Server: none
