In the properties of the Start button, I found it can be modified more to my liking. I was able to remove things like My Document, My Pictures and a few other items I never use. I was able to add Administrative Tools which I find very helpful. This may help others to modify their Start Menu to their liking as it did me.

To do this Right Click on the Start Menu --> properties, select the Start Menu Tab, then click the customize, then the Advanced Tab. Here you can modify the Start Menu.
