If I right click it it opens the link, so I cannot delete it, I have deleted all temp internet files and cookies, I have run various spy ware and adware programs, including

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up-to-date Norton AV. As this is not spy or adware, it is not detected, It seems to be simply a link, The link is shown just under the "Run" option. How can I remove it?
