1. To move photos to another folder

Open My Computer and open the folder

Select the files you want to move.

Look at the menu on the left under File and Folder task

Click on Move

A window will open for you to select the folder you want or make a new folder.

2. To see the file name in thumbnail view if you don't see them now.

Open the folder in thumbnail view

Click on the View icon and change view to details

Hold the shift key down and click on the view icon and click on thumbnails.

File name should now be under each thumbnail.

Software:

Roxio. Not what you want. Very good to copy to CD or DVD but not great photo editor.

MS 10. If you are a beginner this is what you want (about \$50.00 now with rebates). Not the greatest manual but great "as you edit" help and will prevent you from making mistakes. If you are a beginner, don't edit original photos, make a copy of the file and edit the copy.

Photo explosion. I have no idea about this.
