> verify that no check boxes are selected in the "Deny" column. Clear any  
> check boxes that are selected in the "Deny" column.
- > 10. Click "Advanced", and then click to select the "Replace permission  
> entries on all child objects with entries shown here that apply to child  
> objects" check box, and then click "OK".
- > 11. Click "Yes" if you are prompted for confirmation.
