If you have the CD AND Product Key/Certificate of Authenticity, YOU are the legal owner of the software license!

Something that you stated doesn't compute. <g> If you "wiped the HDD" then you wouldn't see anyone's name at all.

Best recommendation in a case where you are getting a second-hand system is to indeed wipe the HDD and do a clean install of the OS and any applications. That will protect you in case there are any viruses or spyware lurking on the machine. Although you can change the folder and remove the prior user's info, I highly recommend the clean install approach.
