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I am running Windows XP Professional. The instructions on ATI's website (which have been changed) went thru each step and said that you should not restart after installing the Video drivers even when prompted until you installed the control panel or the control panel would not install properly.

Now the instructions are very vague and I did not print the old ones. So I don't know how to install the new driver. I always update to the newest driver but since they changed the instructions I don't know what procedure to follow to get the new ones installed properly.
