> The Observation ... WinXP reports FTP connection from
>the Server. It shows up in: Start / right click My
>Computer / Manage / Computer Manager / Default FTP
>sight / Current Session / FTP User Session. This "FTP
>User Session" shows that the server is connected to the

>XP box.

> But ... From the server side I get the message
>mentioned earlier, "An error occurred opening that folder
>on the FTP Server. Make sure you have permission to
>access that folder."

> Permissions? ... Yes, I have set and reset all
>permissions I can think of. Must be something else? I
>have also tried it with a login and anonymous: still the
>same message.
