> I have been researching this error and causes of it for a few days now  
> and have found plenty of information regarding it, however, the  
> information doesn't explain or help me solve the problem that I am  
> having.  
>  
> I have seen people say that the event will show up every 5 minutes in  
> the event viewer. In my situation the error appears to show up at  
> random. I can't find a way to make it occur.  
>  
> I have also seen people who have been getting it in conjunction with  
> 1058 errors and 1097 errors. I do have a few of those in the Event  
> Viewer, however these date back almost 6 months. I get the 1030 error  
> several times a day without any other userenv errors, warnings or  
> information.  
>  
> I have also checked into things like DNS and Domain Controller Security  
> Policy. This yields nothing.  
>  
> This is occurring on a Windows 2003 Standard Edition. I also have  
> another server running Windows 2003 SBS and one running Windows 2000  
> Server. Both of these servers are Domain Controllers, and both of them  
> are not giving any 1030 errors.  
>  
> Group Policy is working just fine on all the Servers and Client  
> Computers. Settings are taking effect, I can modify them at will  
> without getting errors, etc.  
>  
> Does anybody out there know something I can try? I am running out of  
> ideas.  
>
