Jerold,

Thanks for the quick reply....I appreciate it. I guess what I'm trying to get at is how to completely prevent users from getting this prompt rather than how to change the number of days prior to expiration that they receive the message. Since the setting is already "not defined" by default I'm a little perplexed as to how to accomplish this.

For example, the default password age setting is defined and shows 42 days in the default domain policy. This is different from the "prompt users to change their password" setting which is not defined by default but still prompts users 14 days prior to expiration.

Hey Everyone,

I'm wanting to turn off the setting that prompts users to change their password (every 14 days by default). I know this is a domain-wide policy and

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I found the specific setting within group policy but it is not defined in 2k/2k3. My guess is to define the policy and change the number of days to 0, but I'm not sure about this.

We are implementing biometric devices across the organization which randomly generates passwords when they expire so we don't want to prompt our users to change them.

If anyone has any experience turning off this reminder domain-wide, your help would be greatly appreciated.
