>Your TCP/IP stack or Winsock library is corrupt. To fix  
the problem:

>

>01. Use Regedit.exe to navigate to:

>HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\System\CurrentControlSet\Services\Winsock.

>

>02. Export the Winsock key to a Winsock.reg file, to save it.

>03. Delete the Winsock key.

>04. Navigate to:

>HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\System\CurrentControlSet\Services\Winsock2.

>

>05. Export the Winsock2 key to a Winsock2.reg file, to  
save it.

>06. Delete the Winsock2 key.

>07. Exit Regedit.exe.

>08. Control Panel / Network and Dial-up Connections.

>09. Right-click Local Area Connection and press Properties.

>10. Select Internet Protocol (TCP/IP) and press Uninstall.

>11. After uninstalling TCP/IP, shutdown and restart your  
computer.

>12. If TCP/IP is NOT automatically re-installed, use  
Control Panel / Network

>and Dial-up Connections.

>13. Right-click Local Area Connection and press Properties.

>14. Press Install.

>15. Press Protocol / Add.

>16. Select Internet Protocol (TCP/IP) under Network  
Protocol, possibly under

>Microsoft, and press OK.

>17. After the TCP/IP install, power off and power on your  
external modem, or

>shutdown and restart your computer.
