> have suddenly been victim to a problem using IE. Overnight
> and with no installations or updates invoked: IE6 gets a
> 'DNS/page cannot be found' error on every URL I enter. I
> have been able to validate my TCP/IP and internet
> connections by getting valid hits on the same URL's when
> using Netscape and Mozilla. I have uninstalled IE and
> reinstalled it with no success. I have also redone XP Pro
> (via the upgrade procedure) and this was also unsuccessful.
> I hate to think I have to wipe clean and reinstall from the
> bottom up. I hypothesize a file corruption somewhere. Can
> anyone tell me where I should be looking? I tried replacing
> my winsock and wsock dll's but no luck. I'm on a Dell P3
> running Windows XP Pro. I'm not using a modem. I am on a
> LAN at work. I use a dedicated T-1 that has no problems
> and, as I stated, this problem is only happening with IE.
> Netscape and Mozilla are working properly. It IS an IE
> problem. Okay...I have tried just about every anti-parasite
> program that exists. I have had literally hundreds of
> 'alleged' parasite worms removed and still IE is not
> hitting a damn thing I try to access. As I stated earlier:
> Netscape and Mozilla are NOT having this problem - only
> Internet Explorer. There IS a problem with Internet
> Explorer. Will somebody PLEASE figure this very frustrating
> problem out. I mean, you guys (Microsoft) made the
> program...why can't you fix it?
