Example... to search for hotmail problems, put this into the search field site:mvps.org hotmail

3. If you have an unneeded DUN connection setup, remove it. (Ctrl Panel> Dial-Up Networking )

4. In Ctrl Panel> Network> Configuration, remove unneeded components (such as Dial-Up Adapter)

5. Do you have the latest version of whatever PPPoE software your ISP provides? Check with your ISP.

And...

If your PPPoE software is Enternet 300, some people report better performance from RASPPPOE <http://www.raspppoe.com/> Your ISP will not provide tech support for RASPPPOE.
