Just to be sure that the machine is malware free:

Try BHODemon 2.0: <http://www.definitivesolutions.com/bhodemon.htm> (safe & easy.)

Then CWShredder, Ad-aware & Spybot <http://mvps.org/winhelp2002/unwanted.htm>

Then look at any programs that might be causing a problem with IE. Look at ad-blockers, toolbars, security/privacy programs, etc. The anti-virus programs have been known to cause a conflict with IE. You may have to reinstall your AV or another program.

> I have IE6 on XPSP2, all updates installed. Malware scans find nothing. No
> hijack symptoms.

>

> My problem is that IE will frequently freeze up, usually but not always
> after closing a window. The progression of symptoms is always identical.
> First, the hourglass cursor appears, and the page becomes unresponsive.

Then

> if I move the cursor to the title bar, the Maximize box becomes disabled.
> The Minimize and Close boxes do not change. After a few more seconds, "Not
> responding" appears in the title bar.

>

> If I have any other IE windows open at the time, they continue to operate
> normally for ten or fifteen seconds, then they begin to exhibit the same
> symptoms as the first window.

>

> This happens several times per day, sometimes two or three times per hour.
