>>>> loading, IE shuts down. Any idea why this happens on certain web  
>>>> pages and how to work around this?

>>> First eliminate any scumware.  
>>> CAUTION!!!! Before you try to remove spyware using any of these  
>>> programs , download a copy of LSPFIX from any of the following

>>> (if your OS is Win2k or XP) The process of removing certain malware
