Unfortunately, neither of these are factors. I have tried using the wildcard, and Require server verification is not on. Like I said, if I add my domain to other zones (Restricted Zone, Local Machine Zone) then my pages will open in these zones correctly. It is only Trusted Sites that is problematic. Also, this only happens on XP/SP2. Windows 2000 Server behaves correctly.

> Hi,

> Two possibilities come to mind:

> In Trusted sites, "Require server verification" may need to be unchecked and

> listings in Trusted Sites may need to be wildcarded- ie. "\*.yahoo.com"

> instead of "weather.yahoo.com"

>

> Or, renaming the pages from somewebpage.htm to somewebpage.hta should get

> them out of the Internet Zone.
