Hi,

Delete the Temporary Internet Files folder– it may be corrupted. A new one will be created on restart. Set the size of the new folder to 50–60 MB. See <http://mvps.org/winhelp2002/delcache.htm>

Did you try this?

>> Longshot, but, Internet Options> Advanced> Security> check "Allow active  
>> content to run in  
>> files on My Computer ." If this doesn't help, change it back– for security.

>> Some possibilities:  
>> Go to Internet Options> Security> Internet Zone, set it to Default.  
>>  
>> Clear the IE cache. IE> Tools> Internet Options> General> Delete  
>> files (and delete offline content when that dialog pops up) It's often  
>> recommended that the TIF folder be kept at about 50 MB (Settings.)  
>>  
>> Disable (as a test) any third-party security programs to see if one of  
them  
>> is blocking  
>> scripts, scripting, active content. Norton Internet Security can cause  
>> problems of this nature with XP SP2.  
>>  
>> Uninstall Java Runtime Environment (from add/remove programs) and  
download  
>> and install the latest version of J2SE-JRE from  
>> <http://java.sun.com/j2se/1.4.2/download.html>  
>>  
>> Try Firefox from mozilla.org. Java information at  
>> <http://www.mozilla.org/support/firefox/faq#q2.2>  
>>  
>> Longshot, but, Internet Options> Advanced> Security> check "Allow active  
>> content to run in  
>> files on My Computer ." If this doesn't help, change it back- for  
security.
