Hi,
OK. It's probably a Javascript problem.

Some possibilities:

Go to Internet Options> Security> Internet Zone, set it to Default.

Clear the IE cache. IE> Tools> Internet Options> General> Delete files (and delete offline content when that dialog pops up) It's often recommended that the TIF folder be kept at about 50 MB (Settings.)

Check any third-party security programs to see if one of them is blocking scripts, scripting, active content. Norton Internet Security and a number of other programs can be configured to block scripts.

Try these two commands from Start> Run> cmd [enter]
regsvr32 vbscript.dll [enter]
regsvr32 jscript.dll [enter]

Reinstall the scripting engine. Go to
<http://msdn.microsoft.com/library/default.asp?url=/downloads/list/webdev.asp>
for the appropriate download of Windows Script 5.6
