> cannot completely restrict browsing by editing the registry or the use of

> censorware on the host to which you permit access. If the user has

> physical access to the computer, they can bypass any security you have

> implemented on it. After all, all they have to do is visit the newsgroups

> to ask how to nullify whatever you implemented on the host you let them

> use. You need to use an upstream host or a firewall (which is

> inaccessible to your users) to restrict where your users can go.

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
