- > Turn on the Windows Firewall (from Control Panel or Security Center) and
- > disable third-party firewalls, security, privacy, ad-blocking, AV programs
- > to see if one of them is causing this.

- > Clear the IE cache. IE> Tools> Internet Options> General> Delete files (and
- > delete offline content when that dialog pops up) It's often recommended that
- > the TIF folder be kept at about 50 MB (Settings.)
- >
- > Control Panel> Java Plug-in> Cache> Clear.

- > Internet Options> Advanced> try checking Java (Sun) and unchecking Microsoft
- > VM. Then try the reverse.
