- | 2. In the console tree, expand Domain (where Domain is the domain in
which
| the computer account on which you want to run RSoP exists), and then
expand
| Computers.
- | 3. Right-click the computer account on which you want to run RSoP, point
to
| All Tasks, and then click Resultant Set of Policy (Logging) or Resultant
| Set of Policy (Planning).

| we've configured our environment to autodetect proxy configuration
recently.

| This is done two ways.

- | 1. DHCP option 252. Pointing to a load balanced UNC path
| (file://\UNC\PACFILE).
- | 2. "Use automatic configuration script" option is set to the same UNC
| path.

| Both options ("Automatically detect settings" & "Use automatic
| configuration
| script") are activated via GPO. Either on its own or both together
