Don this is not the best group, there are some specific to Outlook, and I don't use outlook much so don't know all the options, but have you checked under tools>options>security tab to see if it's set to automatically download pictures etc? Also there you should find a "Zone" setting and I would recommend the Restricted Zone always. Setting Restricted may help with your specific problem but I just don't know for sure.

I feel sure if you locate the outlook newsgroup someone will have an instant answer though. I recommend using Outlook Express for newsgroups rather than the awful web thing. Makes it much easier because you can search for clues quickly before even asking a question, and for something as complex as Outlook it could be useful in future.
