> Are the accounts POP3 or IMAP? POP3 would use the folders provided in
> Outlook Express. IMAP would result in a download of mirrored folders that
> exist on the server. It is possible to incorrectly set-up a POP3 account.
It

> might say downloading Inbox instead of downloading messages. With POP3 all
> messages would go to the default (POP3) inbox without the use of message
> rules.

> Once we get past the question about the type of account the rest of the
> problems can be addressed. Outlook Express message rules only work with
POP3

> accounts. Do you know of a Highstream support page that details how to
> set-up a mail account. It sounds like this may have been done with the
