This is really a question for your OS newsgroup, but I just had a similar experience.

I had to reload XP/SP2. Prior to that, when I booted up I was taken directly to the Desktop. After the install, I had to click on the Icon at the Welcome Screen to continue to my Desktop and I never set a logon password.

I inquired and was first told to remove NET.Framwork, which didn't help. This was the solution that worked for me. It includes instructions whether you had a password, or not.

If you go to the Control Panel | User Accounts, you should see an ASP.NET account that was created. Leave the ASP.NET account and go to Start | Run and type:

Control userpasswords2

Uncheck "users must enter a user name and password to use this computer"  
Click apply  
On the popup window type in your user name,password,and confirm the password  
Click OK  
Click OK

If you never entered a logon password when setting up the machine, go to Control Panel | User Accounts and create a password for your account. Now go back and do the above again.

I know it doesn't make sense that you have to have a password in order to ignore it, but you are dealing with Microsoft.

Hope this helps.
