Thanks Bruce, but that Knowledge Base article refers specifically to a hotfix for Windows XP SP1 and I already have XP SP2 in which this hotfix would supposedly have been incorporated. The hotfix described "is only intended to correct the problem that is described in this article" which is not what is happening. Having a "complete URL in the subject line or in the body of the e-mail message" is not the "Send a Link" functionality of OE5.5 with the page TITLE in the subject line and as the label of the attached link, and whatever fix they added to XP SP2 did not restore that functionality. The added text in the body of the email is what I quoted and not the virus warning mentioned in the KB article, but I guess the fix mentioned would remove any text message beyond the URL. As far as my others questions, would you know if I can install OE5.5 under WinXpPro or whether Outlook 2003 sends links like OE5.5? Thanks.
