In OE the message appears in what I assume is the Arial font, and when printed "normally" it prints in Arial.

However, if I use OETool to open Full Screen, then print (using Ctrl+P, naturally <grin>), the font appears to be Times Roman (certainly not Arial, anyway).

Is this normal, or what you experience/would expect?
