Click Start, Run and enter REGEDIT Go to:

HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Microsoft\Windows\CurrentVersion\Media Center

Look in the right pane for the value called "Ident". Is it at least 3.0? If you have a base MCE 2005 system it should read 3.0. For a system with Update Rollup 1 it should be 3.1.

>> >> Note the 4D36E967 portion..... Look in the right pane for a value called UpperFilters. This is a  
REG\_MULTI\_SZ type and on my system reads PartMgr. Does yours read the same? If not, right click the  
{4D36E967-E325-11CE-BFC1-08002BE10318} and select Export. This creates a backup REG file that can  
be re-imported by double clicking it. Now double click the UpperFilters value and change it to read PartMgr.  
Now try to reconnect with the Extender. A reboot should not be necessary, but you never know. If you have  
multiple entries in the UpperFilters value, post back before you make any changes.
