That may be your problem – UpperFilters shouldn't be blank. To fix this, paste the below into a run window and click okay.

```
reg add
HKLM\SYSTEM\CURRENTCONTROLSET\CONTROL\CLASS\{4D36E967-E325-11CE-BFC1-08002BE10318} /v UPPERFILTERS /t REG_MULTI_SZ /d PartMgr /f
```

A reboot will be needed for this to take effect

Typically, this error message indicates that some application trashed a catalog on your PC containing signatures needed for Extender to function (hence the failed system validation). A second (less likely)

possibility is

that an app deleted a registry entry that it shouldn't have. Could you

look

under the following registry key and tell me what's listed as

UPPERFILTERS?

(Start --> "regedit" <enter> --> navigate to the reg key)
