And I get my internet connection via cable. Do they automatically route to every cable connection in my house? If so, could I just get a router for each cable drop?

I was having a similar problem and did not want to stretch wiring all over the house to create a wired network. Instead of that, I picked up two Netgear HDX101 Powerline Ethernet adapters. They allow you to use your household electrical wiring as your LAN. One plugs into the wall near your PC and connects to your router, while the other plugs into the wall near your extender and connects to it. I now have good connectivity, and the extender is working fine.

I have my Xbox 360 connected to my media center (yeah!). Unfortunately, both my Media center and my Xbox360 are wireless. The system does not perform at all and it is clearly recommended not to do this as it will not work well. My question is, is there a setting where I can use the 20GB HD on the Xbox360 to buffer or download some of those shows?
