>> The correct way is Open Windows Explorer. Navigate to the old
>> location,
>> select the folder(s), and files you want to copy. Then on the Edit
>> menu,
>> Copy (or you press Ctrl+C). Navigate to the new location, Edit menu,
>> Paste.
>> (or you press Ctrl+V).
>>
>> That will make copies of the files. Be sure that where you go to
>> delete
>> to
>> old files that you do not have to newly copied file selected, press
>> Delete.
>> That will move the deleted files into the Recycle bin (if there is
>> enough
>> room).
>>
>> If you use Cut, that copies the files to the new location and deletes
>> them
>> from the old location in the same action. It is safer to Copy then
>> delete
>> after you have confirmed the files transferred OK.
