In Windows XP, not MCE, double click the clock. On the Time Zone tab uncheck Automatically adjust clock for daylight saving changes.

Then your computer should ignore the time change. You would of course have to manually set your computers clock to the correct time. Be sure you have the correct Time Zone selected also.
