I have found that minimizing and maximizing the media center window sorts out the problem (for a while)...I too have not found a solution. If you change the codec using vmcd.exe and decchekc it might help...but when I did

"Curious" wrote:

MC will only allow you to configure one of the tuners at a time on your Hybrid 950 tuner card. If running MCE2005 you can not configure the ATSC tuner unless you have a separate NTSC tuner configured. The 950 card does not have a hardware encoder chip and I don't know if there is a MC compatible driver for its software encoder.
