I'm rather at a loss as to how to set my PC (Windows Vista Ultimate) up to watch TV. I've bought a PC that (apparently) came with a TV tuner card, and on top of that I bought a remote, which also comes with a white thing with a USB cable and another little wire with a red thing on the end that you presumably plug into the white thing.

Anyway, I plugged the white thing into a USB port on my PC and Windows told me that it had downloaded drivers and that everything was fine. I then plugged the other wire (with the red thing) into the socket on the white thing which read "IR1" (there's also an "IR2") and put my batteries into the Vista Remote, but when I tried to go through the whole first-time set-up for Windows Media Center, it did not find any services after its scan and so I can't watch TV at the moment.
