 - > your domain (which can lead to huge event logs). If you want to audit a
 - > particular partition or directory, then what you have already described
 - > (auditing the folder or partition) will yield more useful information. This
 - > is by design! You can turn off Object Access auditing in AD and simply have
 - > the folders you want audited and your logs will reflect that.
