The administrators group has no permissions or rights over the laptop by default. You need to be a member of domain admins group, or add another [domain] group to the local administrators group of the laptop, to be able to do this.

The Domain Admins group is automatically added to the local administrators group of any domain member when that machine is joined to the domain. Therefore a domain admins member is an administrator on that member. The administrators group has full control over AD and the DC or member, but nothing else.
