I am receiving some entries in my event logs for several Windows 2003 Servers (w/SP1) and a Windows 2000 Server. Here are the details:

ADDITIONAL INFO

If this computer is a domain controller for the specified domain, it sets up the secure session to the primary domain controller emulator in the specified domain. Otherwise, this computer sets up the secure session to any domain controller in the specified domain.

This errors seems to be happening every 3 days. Our only solution right now is to reboot the server. When this happens, it seems that we can't connect to the server, and receive some RPC errors.

I have done a DCDIAG on all my domain controllers (all DCs are WS03 SP1 R2), and that have shown no errors.

Any suggestions? I'm open to give out more information as required too.
