I'm sharing various folders on a drive on the network, and I want users to have read-only access to everything except their own folder.

Share Full permissions to everyone (Sharing tab)
NTFS permissions (Security Tab) readonly permission to authenticated users,
and Full permissions to creator owner.

The problem is, that users can't edit anything at all (even if I explicitly give them full control under the security tab) unless I give everyone full control under the sharing tab. But if that's checked, then I can't
