We want to create a template user account; the problem is when we copy the account not all the fields are copied over to the new account. I have tried to edit the schema in Active Directory but with no luck; i have also change the registry settings so that the Schema Update Allowed are set to 1.

[I am not convinced that you have a reason for changing the schema but don't know that the opposite is true either...]

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In any case, three things have to be true to change the Schema:

- 1) Be a Schema Admin (member of the group which is empty by default, but which Enterprise Admins control)
- 2) Connect to the Schema Master
- 3) Enable changes

(You should reverse these when finished, i.e., disable changes and remove yourself from the group.)

On the technet web site they suggest i must right click on the Active Directory Schema then select Operations Master and select The Schema may be modified on this server; there is no such a command or button. The section we need to edit is grey'd out and i can not activate it.

What type of "edit" are you trying to actually make...
