We have not applied the Exchange DST patch yet, but I am bracing myself for this very issue. The service account we use for BES is a member of the Exchange View Only Admin Role, which I understand is also considered a protected group. If we give Send As permissions to the BES service account at the domain level and allow the rights to propagate, will the rights be removed by the adminSDHolder object? In addition, what will happen when the BES account permissions are inherited by a user who is a member of Domain Admins or any of the other protected groups? Any insight is greatly appreciated!

Microsoft has a work around, but the work around calls for us admins to create a new mailbox and give us domain admins send as rights to that mailbox. This isn't what we want to do, that is too much work for something so simple as email. All we need to do is for AD to allow us to put the send as permission on Domain Admin accounts. Please help.

I would assume the MS workaround would be describing how MS suggests you fix the problem that occurs when you run the DST patch for Exchange and there are Blackberrys involved. They usually provide a workaround because it is easier than the alternative.

If you don't want to follow the MS work around, maybe you should check with Blackberry and see if they provide a solution that is more to your liking.

The DST patch for exchange server doesn't allow any user to send as a domain admin.  
This is an issue because us 4 domain admins at work here can't send emails from our blackberry anymore.  
We have tried to manually reapply the send as permission to each domain admin account,  
but after about an hour the permission is removed. We also have set the send as permission on the AdminSDHolder object and have the domain admins inherit the permission. That doesn't work because after the same period of time the check box that allows the account to inherit permissions from above becomes unchecked. Is there any way to apply the send as permission to the domain admins? Microsoft has a work around, but the work around calls for us admins to create a new mailbox and give us domain admins send as rights to that mailbox. This isn't what we want to do, that is too much work for something so simple as email. All we need to do is for AD to allow us to put the send as permission on Domain Admin accounts. Please help.
