When a machine joins the domain (Domain Controllers are included in this) it is assigned a password. When you reboot it, when the machine is starting back up it is required to log onto the domain, just like a user account. By default the password is changed every 30 days, if your machine has been turned off over the change the machine is unable to log back on until you either remove and add the machine from the domain –or– using nltest or netdom to reset the machine account.
